SEMESTER I & II

This course

- 1. inspires students to read and understand texts written by writers across different ages.
- 2. gets familiar with representative literary and cultural texts within a significant number of historical, geographical, and cultural contexts.
- 3. traces the development of history of English Literature from Chaucer to

20th century.

- 4. acquaints with major religious, political and social movements from 14th to 20th century and their influence on literature.
- 5. recognises and reproduces English speech sounds and phonemic transcriptions in British English (Received Pronunciation).
- 6. distinguishes the nuances of English speech sounds, word accent, intonation and rhythm.
- 7. Makes Students to identify, analyze, interpret and describe the critical ideas, values, and themes that appear in literary and cultural texts.
- 8. Makes students to apply critical and technical theory and vocabulary to describe and analyze, and formulate an argument about literary and other texts.
- 9. Locates and represents subaltern voices through their own writings.
- 10. becomes thorough with reading works with theoretical basis.
- 11. Makes students capable of interpreting and exploring relationships from the points of view of different people.
- 12. get sensitized with the critical tools used in the reading of literature
- 13. forms an idea of the complex nature of literary studies and how they are entangled with other aspects of the social body.
- 14. Enriches students in the history of English Poetry, Drama, Fiction and Prose.
- 15. Makes students familiar with Phonetics and linguists and their theories.
- 16. traces the development of history of English literature from its beginning to the present day.

M.A.ENGLISH

SEMESTER III & IV

This course

- 1. Enriches students to analyze the social, political, and cultural issues reflected in Indian writing in English.
- 2. Interpret the emergence and growth of Indian Writing in English in the context of colonial experience, social and political background.
- 3. familiarizes the literature of the America.
- 4. educates them on the idea of resistance against vices as exemplified in the writings of the native Americans.
- 5. Students are able apply critical and theoretical approaches to the reading and analysis of literary and cultural texts in multiple genres.
- 6. makes the students analyze and interpret literature
- 7. enhances the critical thinking of students by introducing to them a bunch of literary and political theories.
- 8. Learns the history of literary criticism and various literary theories.
- 9. Exposes how and why Indian literature emerged as a distinct field of study.
- 10. provides an overview of the various phases of the evolution of Indian writing in English.
- 11. introduces students to the thematic concerns, genres and trends of Indian writing in English.
- 12. exposes students to the pluralistic aspects of Indian culture and identity.
- 13. Demonstrate, through discussion and writing, an understanding of significant cultural and societal issues presented in Indian English literature.
- 14. Know the meaning of Popular Literature and its distinct characters.
- 15. Provides critically interact with works from different contexts: social, political, economic, historical and national as subjects conscious of their own socio-historic specificity and thus their level of critical thinking is enhanced.
- 16. Investigates approach and appreciate Indian literature in English and explore its uniqueness and its place among the literatures in English.
- 17. learns what language is and what knowledge a language consist of. This is provided by basic examination of internal organization of sentences, words, and sound systems.
- 18. learn literary terms and the various streams in literary criticism, to make them aware of the interdisciplinary nature of contemporary criticism and to develop in students, skills for literary criticism.
- 19. inculcates a literary, aesthetic and critical awareness of diverse cultures and literary creations and thus to arrive at a broader vision of the world.
- 20. enlightens the students with the evolutions of English language.
- 21. makes them known how culture made changes to English language from time to time.
